USING CRITICAL RACE THEORY AND RACIAL MICROAGGRESSIONS TO EXAMINE EVERYDAY RACISM

DR. SOLORZANO WILL DISCUSS RACIAL MICROAGGRESSIONS, THE COVERT OR EVERYDAY FORMS OF SYSTEMIC RACISM USED TO KEEP PEOPLE IN RACIAL MARGINS OF SOCIETY. DR. SOLORZANO WILL DESCRIBE DIFFERENT TYPES OF RACIAL MICROAGGRESSIONS THAT PEOPLE OF COLOR EXPERIENCE, THE VARIOUS CONTEXTS IN WHICH THEY OCCUR, THEIR EFFECTS ON PEOPLE OF COLOR, AND HOW PEOPLE OF COLOR RESPOND TO THEM.

Bio:

DR. SOLORZANO IS A PROFESSOR OF SOCIAL SCIENCE AND COMPARATIVE EDUCATION IN THE GRADUATE SCHOOL OF EDUCATION AND INFORMATION STUDIES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, LOS ANGELES (UCLA). HE IS ALSO A PROFESSOR IN THE CHICANA AND CHICANO STUDIES DEPARTMENT AND WOMEN'S STUDIES AT UCLA. IN ADDITION, HE IS THE DIRECTOR OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, ALL CAMPUS CONSORTIUM ON RESEARCH FOR DIVERSITY (UCACCORD). HIS TEACHING AND RESEARCH INTERESTS INCLUDE: CRITICAL RACE AND GENDER THEORY IN EDUCATION; RACIAL MARGINALITY AND MICROAGGRESSIONS IN EDUCATION; AND RACE/ETHNIC, GENDER, AND CLASS RELATIONS WITH A SPECIAL EMPHASIS ON THE EDUCATIONAL ACCESS, PERSISTENCE, AND GRADUATION OF STUDENTS OF COLOR IN THE UNITED STATES. DR. SOLORZANO HAS AUTHORED MORE THAN 60 ARTICLES, BOOK CHAPTERS AND REPORTS ON ISSUES OF EDUCATIONAL ACCESS AND EQUITY FOR UNDERREPRESENTED MINORITY POPULATIONS IN THE UNITED STATES. IN 2007, HE WAS AWARDED THE UCLA DISTINGUISHED TEACHER AWARD. DR. SOLORZANO RECEIVED HIS PH.D. IN SOCIOLOGY OF EDUCATION FROM CLAREMONT GRADUATE SCHOOL.

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
